Competition Format

The format for the Tetrathlon Rally will be in four phases:

Swimming (will be ran Monday 6/15 at Woodmoor County Club in Monument in the late afternoon with a pizza party after the swim)

Shooting (11 and under can use 2 hands) (use of a bench for Pre & Mini Novice Divisions (at Pendragon Equestrian Center)

Running (will be done on the cross-country course of Pendragon Equestrian Center in Larkspur)

Stadium Jumping (slip rail and gate only at Novice and Above) No Optimum Time for Pre-Novice and Mini-Novice

Teams are organized based on rating and age, and will be offered as follows (By these Divisions)

New Intermediate Division - This level is meant to be a entry level division for 12 years and above and must be D-3 and above to help encourage pony clubbers to participate in Tetrathlon. Jumping, Running, Swimming and Shooting is all the same at the **Novice Division** listed above except for the 12 years and older age. You are only allowed to compete in this division for ONE year and this is a Championship Division. At the Championships the Intermediate Division will not be eligible for overall competition high score awards based on the reduced distances and jumping heights for the same age groups in Junior and Senior Divisions.

You may be rated below your level/age division but you must drop one level for the jumping/riding phase and a 200 point penalty will be added onto your riding score. Competitors at different levels/age divisions may **not** be combined to form teams overall or in any phase unless there is not enough riders in the division. (This only applies to the USPC pony club rally members).

Non-Pony Clubbers (or Jr. Pony Clubbers not ready for rallies) and Adults - This is designed for runners, swimmers or riders to try out this great sport of Tetrathlon. It will be run as the same format as the Tetrathlon Rally and no rating requirements (age and divisions and Adults will be in the Intermediate Level) but with these differences. There will be no horse management judging or written tests. If you bring a horse, you will need to follow the same horse management expectations as the pony clubbers in the rally. Additionally you will be allowed assistance from coaches and parents. If you would like you can compete as a individual and will be grouped with a team or else as a scramble team (a different individual can do each phase). We will have a few extra pistols to share and will offer a practice time on the first day of check-in under supervision of the shooting steward. You may also share a pony clubbers horse for the riding phase. Have all your friends and family and test your athletic talents. You will compete as an individual. Coaching

Shooting Phase - Coaching is permitted during the firing of the sighting shots. Competitors may be assisted by a loader during the competition but shall receive no instruction, verbal or otherwise, from the loader. Competitors may share air pistols but must let the organizers know in advance.

Swimming Phase - Coaches are permitted to advise competitors during the warm-up period prior to the competition. They are not permitted to walk the side of the pool or deck during the race.

Competitors can stop and rest by standing but must not walk the pool.

Running Phase - Coaches are permitted to walk the course with the competitors and advise the competitors during the walk and in the warm-up area. Moving with or pacing the competitor will result in elimination.

Riding Phase - Coaches are permitted to walk courses and advise competitors in the warm-up area and during a short after-ride briefing only.

A Coaches Briefing will be done prior to each phase.

Scoring

Details for scoring are provided in the USPC Tetrathlon Competition handbook, but the basic elements are- (each phase is scored separately)

Swimming (1100 points possible)

Running (1100 points possible)

Shooting (1100 points possible)

Stadium Jumping (1100 points possible) you may drop down a division in jumping height for 200 pt penalty and we will allow you to drop down up to 3 divisions.

Horse Management Scores (Formal Inspection, Turnback, and Daily Inspection Scores, negative points multiplied by 5)

Horses Used for Tetrathlon (and Modern Pentathlon)

Competitors are expected to provide their own mounts. When circumstances make it necessary, mounts may be shared by up to three competitors. If a competitor is using a mount other than his/her own, the assignment of the mount and rider must be made prior to the competitor's briefing, and Horse Management of the mount and tack will begin at this briefing

Handling of Air Pistols

All air pistols must be turned in at the beginning of the competition to the organizer.

All air pistols must be presented in a case with the competitor's name and Pony Club clearly marked. Locked cases are recommended.

The steward of the shooting phase will examine all air pistols and equipment prior to the shooting phase.

Safety glasses must be worn.

Competitors can share Air Pistols but be sure to let organizer know and list on your entry so we can accommodate the competitors to share.

Awards

Each team will receive an award based on their total overall competition score.

Individuals will be awarded based on their total overall score and in each phase awarded up to 6th place

Awards in Horse Management and Team overall will be given to teams through 6th place.

Championship Qualification

To compete at Championships, a competitor must compete in all four phases, and attain a total score (including Horse Management) of no less than 2400 points. The competitor must have competed in either Senior, Junior, Intermediate or Novice divisions.

Novice 10-11 yrs D-3 and up

Intermediate 12 and up D-3 and up

Junior 12-14 yrs D-3 and up

Senior 15 yrs and up C-1 and up

To compete at Championships the riding judge at the qualifying competition, and the Competitor's DC and RS must approve that the competitor's riding skill is suitable for his/her level of Tetrathlon competition. Other rules apply and are in the USPC 2006 Tetrathlon Competition rulebook.

For Championships - You must include a letter of Intent to Qualify - which is included in your packet

Organizer will allow competitors to ride if they have a recommendation from a riding coach and has access to a horse. We will offer riding from pile of poles up to 3'7".

Youth A, Juniors and Seniors will swim 200 meters/yards, Run 3,000 meters. Youth B and C will swim 200 meters/yards and run 2,000 meters. Youth D and under will swim 100 meters/yards and run 1,000 meters. The shooting will be the old format (not the new run/shoot combination) of 20 shots (with 5 shots per target like the Tetrathlon). Swimming will be at Woodmoor Country Club Monday 6/15 late afternoon with a Pizza Party to follow after the swimming competition.

Fencing – Protective clothing is necessary. We will have armourer at the fencing portion which is set for the late afternoon on Tuesday 6/16. We will have equipment rental available and basic initial coaching for \$15 per competitor. Done at Pendragon Equestrian Center and we will have 2 or 3 fencing strips set up in the barn.

Riding – The riding height will be based on age. Senior, Junior will jump 3'7" and all other divisions will jump based on the age group for Tetrathlon. You may drop down up to 3 height divisions with a 200 drop down penalty per division drop down.

All competitors must have their own insurance in case of accidental injury or illness. Pine Ridge Pony Club, Pendragon Equestrian and United States Pony Club will assume no responsibility financial or other, for loss, injury or illness of any competitor or spectator.

Awards – We will offer awards 1st-3rd per division and additionally give awards 1st-3rd for highest points for each discipline (swimming, shooting, riding, running and fencing) and if a tie the tie breaker will be based on the closest to optimum/fastest time.

These same divisions are offered in the non-pony club divisions and not limited to youth and is open to adults also. Dressage – All tests will be done a small dressage arena 20 by 40 meters sand arena. Tests CAN BE called to riders in the NON-PONY CLUB divisions. Coaching WILL BE ALLOWED in the PONY CLUB and NON-PONY club divisions for the dressage phase.

Show Jumping - Beginner Novice and Above will have an optimum time for show jumping. Pile of Poles to Elementary will not have a time limit.

Awards – Team overall awards will be given first through sixth place.
Horse Management awards will be given 1st through 3rd place.
Individual Awards will be given 1st through 6th for each division.
